Fees and Program Details are similar to 2017

Fees are as follows: (All sessions are 1 hour in Length)

1 session \$15 per student

- 2 sessions \$20 per student
- 3 sessions \$25 per student

Session Dates: Monday - Friday May 7th – 25th (except May 21 which is a holiday)

9-10 am, 10:15-11:15 am, 11:30-12:30 pm, 1-2 pm

Plus additional dates can be available in June (Contact us to book June)

Please note, once filled, timeslots will be hidden from view.

All students will be required to complete a Canoe Kayak BC Waiver form. FOR 2018 we are using PAPER Waiver forms ONLY (teachers prefer it!!). Paper Forms are available on the registration front page.

<u>Please bring completed Wavier Forms, a list of emergency</u> <u>contacts, and any medical concerns to your first session.</u>

- Teachers will be asked to arrange youth into teams of 20 or less, at or before the first session, before handing them off to the program coaches. Any students who have participated previously will be positioned towards the front of the boat and less experienced/comfortable students to the rear.
- This year we will have boat positions for up to 40 participants (2 dragon boats of 20) plus a steer person for each boat. (in limited cases, we might be able to accommodate up to 60 students).

- Minimum participant numbers are 13 per boat.
- Teachers and 1 parent paddler for every 10 students can participate for free. (space permitting)

A general outline of the sessions:

- Session 1: Introduce paddling equipment and safety rules. Basic Stroke Technique, importance of timing and teamwork. Entry and exit of boat. Paddle 1-2 km
- Session 2: Review of previous session, particularly safety rules. Introduce more stroke technique and timing details including: reach, "A" position, and exit. Paddle 2-3 km.
- Session 3: Review of previous sessions. Practice Paddling Technique at different speeds. Cover "how to race" and what to expect during a dragon boat regatta. Paddle 3-4 km including race starts and simulations.

At the end of the sessions students will have knowledge of:

- Safety procedures in and around the water
- Sizing and correct fitting of a lifejacket
- How to correctly hold a paddle and correct position in the boat
- Parts of a Dragon boat and paddle
- Different Dragon boat strokes
- The importance of teamwork to propel the boat
- Introduction to race preparation including starts, race simulations, and power ups.

Notes:

- As with any water sport there is a possibility of getting wet. Students may be accidentally splashed and are asked to prepare accordingly.
- A water bottle and sunscreen are also recommended.

NOTE - There will be School Dragon Boat Championships in 2018, on Saturday, May 26th. This is a separate event to our School Dragon Boat sessions (details about costs and registration info to follow). The School Dragon Boat Championships are run by CanoeKayak BC (not Burnaby Canoe & Kayak Club)
